Lean, helping Springwire to become world class

Springwire is underway with a large project, the aim of which is to improve quality and delivery accuracy with the help of Lean. This is a company wide project, from management level down to the tiniest piece of wire. The management team will be drawing up a contract and a philosophy based on Lean, but which is also tailored for Springwire. This will form the basis of Springwire's approach to fulfilling customer requirements, while creating a highly skilled organisation focusing on the customer, quality and added value.

At the other end of the spectrum is the 5S project that also permeates

the entire company, from office to production. The main aim of 5S is to create order and discipline, but there are also advantages in using 5S as a tool for training in improvement groups. As well as bringing order and discipline, the project will also lead to proactive work on continuous improvements. This will be achieved through improvement groups, which involves everybody in the company.

During the past six months we have seen some major improvements with regard to order and discipline. The work of the improvement groups is still in its prime at Springwire, but has started well and we have already seen several very good improvements.

To help this work on its way, the company has trained all employees in the basics of Lean with the help of IUC, and has also allowed staff to undergo a university education in Lean production at Chalmers University of Technology.

Follow Springwire's road to becoming world class and help us by providing feedback. All customer views are worth their weight in gold to us as we strive to develop Springwire to better meet our customers' demands and expectations.
